Academic Scholarships

A number of diversity-oriented scholarships are offered by various organizations on campus as well as affiliated organizations. These include:

- Departmental diversity scholarships
- Selma Andrews Graduate Scholarship through the School of Behavioral Health
- Black Alumni of Loma Linda and La Sierra Universities
- Latino Alumni of Loma Linda University

Travel Funding

The Department of Psychology offers \$400 in approved travel assistance for students presenting research at national or regional professional conferences (e.g. APA, APS, WPA) in which the student is a formal contributor to a professional poster/paper presentation.

The Diversity Committee also offers travel assistance for students who are connected with an established diversity mentorship program (e.g. with APA) and will be meeting with a mentor at a professional conference.

The School of Behavioral Health offers also travel scholarships for students presenting research at a professional conference (\$500 for domestic travel, \$1,000 for international travel).

Research Awards

Students are encouraged to submit their research projects to the William James Award for Excellence in Research for a \$250 cash prize and departmental recognition.

Primary Care Training Grants

A number of funded clinical training positions are offered with the Department of Family Medicine for students interested in primary care and/or health psychology. These grant-funded opportunities offer unique clinical training and exposure to an integrated health care setting within a culturally diverse underserved community.

- HRSA Primary Care Training Enhancement (PCTE) Grant A two-year clinical practicum placement with \$10,000 tuition waiver and \$20,000 stipend granted over two years
- HRSA Psychology Integration in Primary Care for Substance Use Disorders (PIPCS)
 A one-year clinical practicum placement with \$25,000 stipend
