Start of essay:

- 1) State your purpose in applying for graduate study.
- 2) Describe how your background, accomplishments, and life experiences led to your decision to pursue the graduate degree for which you are applying. Include any educational, personal, cultural, economic, or social experiences, challenges or opportunities that are relevant to, or which prepared you for, graduate study in psychology.
- 3) Please expand upon your desired area(s) of interest and the faculty you would like to work with. If known at this point, include any of our department Specializations that are of interest to you (i.e., Child and Adolescent Clinical Psychology, Clinical Neuropsychology, Health Psychology and Integrated Care, Clinical Generalist).
- 4) Please describe any aspects of your personal background, accomplishments, or achievements that will allow the department to evaluate your potential contributions to the University's diversity mission. Contributions to diversity and equal opportunity can take a variety of forms, such as efforts to advance equitable access to education, public service that addresses the need of a diverse population, or research that explores inequalities.
